PROFILE

Mr. Wang has represented a wide variety of clients, from major institutions in the healthcare, manufacturing, energy, and finance sectors to individuals and EB-5 investment entities. His extensive civil litigation experience spans state law contract and tort disputes to federal antitrust claims, and covers federal, state, and arbitral forums as well as all phases of litigation – including trials and appellate work.

Prior to Halpern May Ybarra Gelberg LLP, Mr. Wang was counsel at Huang Ybarra Gelberg & May LLP. Before that, he practiced at the law firms of Irell & Manella LLP and Arnold & Porter, where he litigated a broad variety of disputes, including private antitrust lawsuits and non-antitrust civil actions brought by government agencies. Mr. Wang began his legal career as a law clerk to the Honorable Richard R. Clifton of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

Mr. Wang received his J.D. from Yale Law School, where he was an Executive Editor of the *Yale Journal on Regulation* and a Senior Editor of the *Yale Law Journal*. He received his undergraduate degree from Harvard University, where he was elected in his junior year to Phi Beta Kappa and later graduated *magna cum laude* with a concentration in Economics.

Mr. Wang is an elected member of the American Law Institute, a leading organization that produces scholarly work (Restatements, Model Codes, and Principles of Law) to clarify, modernize, and improve the law. Mr. Wang also serves as an Adviser on the ALI's Restatement (Fourth) of Property.
